




Life Course & Oral Health







The Opportunity of a Life Course View

- Being orally healthy is a life-long process
 - Intrinsic and extrinsic events at various periods of time can affect oral health
- Life course theory has bi-directional implications
 - Social determinants of health
 - Oral disease can undermine people's overall health, psychosocial, and economic status
- Dental payment and benefit design can be informed by lifespan
 - Two separate and disparate systems of coverage shape access to dental care and appear to thwart efforts to improve oral health





From Big Data to Better Patient Outcomes

- Integrated dental and medical claims data
 - 31 million Medicaid & 45 million commercial/Medicare supplemental claims
 - Representative of 55% of total dental spending in the US





Data Sources and Data Definitions

- Categorization & transformation of dental claims and medical claims for dental conditions
 - Preventive & Basic Dental Procedures
 - Major Dental Procedures
 - Medical Care for Dental Conditions
 - Dental care by PCP, ambulatory surgery, ED visits, inpatient admissions, oral cancer, Rx




Methodological Approaches to Analysis of Data


- Descriptive patterns
- Probabilistic variations in patterns
 - Variations by payors, policy, demographics, treatment history, or chronic conditions
- Treatment trajectories
 - How spending and utilization patterns now influence trajectories of care later




Average per Enrollee Spending on Oral Health Care among Those Enrolled in Medicaid over the Lifetime




Average per Enrollee Spending on Oral Health Care among Those Enrolled in Commercial Insurance over the Lifetime




Proportion of Spending in Medicaid Plans in 2017





Proportion of Spending in FFS Commercial Plans in 2017

Key Takeaways

- Overall deficiency in oral health care use and spending during the first 4 years of life.
- Young adult spending "cliff" persists in Medicaid, where medical spending on dental conditions dominates.
- Coverage and subsequent spending is not reflective of the causal pathway between inflammatory chronic conditions and periodontal disease.





Scenario A:


1/3 with complicated cases, hard to grow practice

- Positioned for new payment models




